

I think that they're kind of breadth and depth has certainly expanded. There is certainly an emphasis on equity. When we run leadership camps for the students from across the board and these students kind of run it. And a lot of the workshops that they do with the students through the course of the weekend have a social justice slant to it. That's often the goal of what they are trying to accomplish through this. So, I think that, you know, there are a lot of kids that may have been focused on one aspect of equity, but when they are in a large group with such as diversified clientele, they are kind of exposed to the other pillars. They may have just been concerned with the religious aspect, and then they see the anti-homophobia piece. And sometimes that can be in conflict and sometimes there's a nice marriage that happens between them because they both realize that at the root of it all it's just equity. And, it's hard for one group to understand their own equity issues without understanding everybody else's as well.
